In Jewish culture marriages were arranged by the parents. The groom would return to his father's house where he would build an addition onto the family compound during an espousal period that could last for a year or even years. When the father said it was time, the son would go to get his bride. He would bring her back for a week of *presentation* and celebration with his community, at the end of which the wedding would take place. The wedding would be followed by a marriage supper attended by those privileged to receive an invitation. Look up and read John 14:2-3 in the light of the previous statement.
