History makes it clear that it was all loss and no not to them if Christ was not raised. They shared their testimony in Jerusalem where many had witnessed events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. Immediately the religious leaders among the Jews gan to persecute them, hauling them off to prison, beating them, and in the years that followed they were secuted by Jews and Gentiles alike, even being put to death for their faith.  They were so full of conviction for the resurrection that they traveled thousands of miles across land and a to preach the Gospel. They were brought before emperors and kings and governing authorities. They are threatened with torture and death, but not one of them ever withdrew his/her testimony concerning rist's resurrection. They declared that Jesus of Nazareth was the Son of God, that He died for our sins, He is buried and rose again that we might receive the gift of eternal life.
