2. What does John tell us about the inspiration of the things he wrote in Revelation?

3. What claims did Jesus make regarding His Word?

4. What reoccurring theme is found in this last chapter?
Revelation 22:7, 12, 20; 2 Peter 3:8

5. What promise does Christ give for those who read, hear, obey, keep, and guard the words of Revelation? Revelation 22:7; 1:3; 1 Timothy 6:20; 2 Timothy 1:13-14

6. When John heard and saw the awesome things revealed to him by Christ's angel messenger what mistake did he make? What lessons should we learn from this? Revelation 22:6-9

7. What did the angel mean, when he told Daniel not to seal the words of Revelation?
Revelation 22:10; Daniel 12:4, 9

8. What possible heart conditions result when people hear the gospel, the warnings of coming judgment, and that Jesus is coming again? Revelation 22:11

9. In the light of Christ's promised return what should believers be looking forward to?
Revelation 22:12-14; 2 Corinthians 5:10; 1 Corinthians 3:13-15

10. Does Revelation 22:14 contradict the Bible's teaching that that salvation is by grace through faith and not by the works of the Law?
Titus 3:5; Ephesians 2:8-9; John 6:28-29; Acts 16:30-31; 1 John 2:3-4; James 2:14-18

11. What is the contrast in Revelation 22:14-15 between the righteous and the wicked, those who will enter Heaven and those who will be kept out?

12. How is Jesus both the ancestor (root) of David and also his offspring (descendant)?
Revelation 22:16; Matthew 22:41-46

13. Discuss the invitations in Revelation 22:17. Who is being invited to "Come"?

14. What is the severe penalty for those who add or subtract from what God has said in the Bible?
Revelation 22:18-19

15. What should be the prayer and heart cry of every child of God?
Revelation 22:20; 2 Timothy 4:7-8; 1 Corinthians 16:22-23
