Icebreaker: Give some reasons why a child might be adopted.

1. What would it mean to a parentless child to be adopted?

Before we look at adoption, let's find out what makes adoption into God's family possible.

Justification

Justification is a change from guilt and condemnation to acquittal and acceptance. It is the judicial act of God whereby He justly declares and treats as righteous those who place their faith in Jesus Christ. Our standing before God then becomes – **Just as if we had never sinned**.

Adoption

8. What does God call us in Galatians 3:26?

Even though you may be a brand new Christian, recently born again through regeneration into the family of God, yet because of your relationship to Jesus, God has adopted you into His family with all the rights and privileges of adult sons.

In Roman culture it was customary to have slaves or household guardians over their children until the children would come of age. When a Roman father considered his boy mature enough to accept the responsibilities of adulthood he would hold an adoption ceremony called the *toga virilis*. Family and friends were invited to witness this celebration as the *toga*, a special robe, was brought out and placed on his son, and the father's signet ring was placed on the young man's finger giving him the rights of a full grown son to transact business in the family name.

Because of justification and our identification with Jesus we are now clothed with the Toga, the robe of Christ's righteousness, and we can now come to the Father in prayer in Jesus name. Jesus said anything that you shall ask the Father in my name He will give it to you.
