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11. What expectation from God should cause us to praise Him with regard to our food, clothing, shelter and other daily needs? Psalm 145:15-16, Matthew 6:25-34

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12. What qualities of God's character can we praise Him for according to Psalm 145:17; and what does this mean to you and me?

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13. What assurances to answered prayer do we find in Psalm 145:18-19?

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14. What is the key to God's loving favor? Psalm 145:20, Matthew 22:37
