Text:	Romans 2:1-16
Romans ch	apter 1:18-32 is God's diagnosis of the unrighteousness of men. Romans chapter 2 is

Romans chapter 1:18-32 is God's diagnosis of the unrighteousness of men. Romans chapter 2 is God's indictment against the self-righteous. The first three chapters are written to show all men outside of Christ their guilt before God.

1. What does God have to say to the self-righteous who point an accusing finger at others when they are guilty of similar sins before God? Romans 2:1 with 1:29-31; 3:10, 23

2. What standard of judgment will God use on Judgment Day according to Romans 2:2, and who will be the judge? John 5:22; 14:6; Acts 17:31

3. What false logic of the self-righteous will come to light on Judgment Day? Romans 2:3

4. What wrong conclusions do self-righteous people often come to when they experience blessing, prosperity, and lack of judgment for the wrong things they are doing? Romans 2:4; Acts 14:15-17

5. What are the self-righteous treasuring up by continuing in their sins and rejecting the Savior which will be poured out on them on Judgment Day? Romans 2:5; 2 Thessalonians 1:6-10

6. What provision did God make to wipe out our sin debt so that sinners can escape God's wrath? John 3:16-18; 5:24

Before we look at the next question it is important to note that Romans 2 does not explain God's plan for our salvation. That will be done in Romans chapters 3 - 5.

7. On what basis will God administer justice, both reward and retribution toward the righteous and the wicked. Romans 2:6; Revelation 20:12-15

8. How is the character and motivation of the righteous described and what is their reward? Romans 2:7, 10; Luke 1:6; Job 1:1

9. How is the character and motivation of the unrighteous described and what is their reward? Romans 2:8-9

10. How is it possible for an unrighteous man to become righteous and do good works? Romans 3:10; Isaiah 64:6; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 2:8-10

11. What great principle of God's righteous judgment do we discover in Romans 2:11? Acts 10:34-35

12. How will God judge the unrighteous who do not have the Ten Commandments, the Bible or the Gospel compared to those who do? Romans 2:12-16
