Spiritual Metamorphosis

Prayer:

Text: Romans 12:1-2

Icebreaker: Define the word metamorphosis and give some examples of creatures that go through it?

1. What three steps must take place in the believer's metamorphosis if we are to experience God's good, acceptable and perfect will in our lives? Romans 12:1-2

2. How did Jesus demonstrate metamorphosis in His incarnation (becoming a man)? John 1:14; Philippians 2:5-7; Matthew 17:1-2

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3. What must take place in a sinner's life before spiritual metamorphosis begins? John 3:7; Titus 3:5; 2 Corinthians 5:17

Sanctification is vitally important if we are to experience the transformation God wants to take place in our lives. Sanctification means being cleansed and set apart (dedicated) to God to live a holy and exemplary life before the world. Sanctification takes place in three phases: past, present and future; or instant, progressive, and completed; or positional, experiential, and final.

4. Describe the instant sanctification that takes place in our lives when we put our trust in the Savior. 1 Corinthians 1:2; 6:9-11; Hebrews 10:10

It is one thing to be called a saint, a holy one, and quite another to live like one. Progressive sanctification is a process by which we are becoming more like Jesus. This is also a work of the Holy Spirit. As we daily surrender and yield our bodies to Him He does the transforming work of sanctification.

10. When will our sanctification be final and complete? 1 John 3:2-3; Ephesians 5:24-27
