Prayer

Text: John 1:1-5

Icebreaker: Discuss why you think God sent the promised Messiah, the King of kings into the world in weakness as a baby, and into such lowly circumstances as the lowly stable in Bethlehem and not to a palace.

1. According to Micah 5:2, how long had the coming Messiah been in existence before He was born in Bethlehem?

2. Many Bible teachers believe that Melchizedek was an epiphany (appearance) of Christ in the Old Testament. What do we learn about this mysterious priest in Genesis 14:18-20, and Hebrews 7:1-3?

3.	From His title in Isaiah 7:14 and Matthew 1:23 what do we learn about the nature of Jesus Christ?
4.	What does Colossians 2:9 teach us about Jesus Divine nature?
5.	What two titles from Isaiah 9:6 indicate that Jesus was truly God in a human body?
6.	According to the following references what great work did Jesus fulfill with His Father when time began? Genesis 1:1, 26, John 1:1-3, Colossians 1:16-17, Hebrews 1:10-12
7.	What great titles does Jesus share with His Father according to Revelation 1:8 & 15:3?

8. What did Job call the Lord Jesus some 2000 years before He was born, and what did His heart yearn for? Job 19:25-27

9. In the gospels Jesus is revealed as the Son of God, and also the Son of Man? Is this a contradiction? Matthew 16:13-17; Luke 19:10

10. The Pharisees did not understand that their promised Messiah would be both the Son of God and the Son of David. Discuss Matthew 22:41-45 with Psalm 110:1.

11. According to John 12:41, John says that Isaiah saw the glory of the Lord Jesus and spoke of Him. Read Isaiah 6:1-5 and describe Isaiah's encounter with the Son of God.

12. What did Jesus do with His glory when He came to be our Savior? Philippians 2:5-8

13. When Jesus finished the work of our redemption what did God do for His Son and how must we respond? Philippians 2:9-11

14. What was John's response when he saw Jesus in all His resurrection glory? Revelation 1:13-18

Think about this week:

Am I, like Job, looking forward to seeing my Redeemer face to face, and then looking forward to returning to rule and reign with Him on the earth? Revelation 19:11-16 describes Jesus return with His saints to rule the nations.

I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war. His eyes were like a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns. He had a name written that no one knew except Himself. He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God.

And the armies in Heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, followed Him on white horses. Now out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should strike the nations. And He Himself will rule them with a rod of iron. He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS.
