4. Why should Jesus' disciples have been able to pray and get deliverance for this demon possessed boy? Matthew 10:1; 17:14-16

5. What were the symptoms of this boy and how did the demonic spirit take advantage of the boy's epilepsy to try to kill him? Mark 9:17-18, 22; Luke 9:39; 1 Peter 5:8

6. Why would Jesus call the crowd a *faithless and perverse generation?* Mark 9:19; Matthew 17:17; Psalm 95:10

7. How must our Lord feel when He sees powerlessness, defeat, compromise, and unbelief in the lives of believers? Mark 9:18b Ephesian 4:17-32

8. What should be the cry of every parent if their children have been taken captive by the devil? Mark 9:22

9.	What is the key that opens the door for God to work in our lives? Mark 9:23; Hebrews 11:6
10.	What great prayer did this father make to Jesus? Mark 9:24
11.	Did Jesus answer the father's cry of faith for his son's deliverance? Mark 9:25-27
12.	Why weren't the disciples able to cast the evil spirit out of the boy? Matthew 17:20-21; Mark 9:28-29; Isaiah 58:6-9
13.	How much faith did Jesus say is required for God to answer our prayers, and what does this teach us about faith? Matthew 17:20
