Such harsh condemnation would have been contrary to His message of love, grace, forgiveness and salvation for sinners. Not just that, but He would be usurping Rome's authority to put someone to death. These men would have liked nothing better than to have the Roman government arrest Jesus and do their dirty work for them, thus saving them face with the people.

## Think about it this week:

That morning a group of hypocrites ran from the *Light of Life* lest their sins should be exposed, but a sinner came to the light and found forgiveness and salvation.

He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed.
