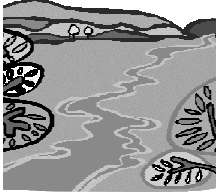

Acts 18:18-19:7

- I. Paul goes on home assignment Acts 18:18-24
 - A. Paul fulfilled a sacred vow v. 18
1 Corinthians 9:19-23; Deuteronomy 23:21-22;
Ecclesiastes 5:4-6
 - B. Paul, Aquila and Priscilla sailed to Ephesus vs. 18-19
 - C. Paul continued his journey home v. 20-22
Romans 9:1-3; 10:1
 - D. Paul's second journey ended at Antioch v. 22
 - E. Paul set out on his third Missionary Journey v. 23

- II. Aquila and Priscilla disciple Apollos Acts 18:24-28
 - A. He was a Jew from Alexandria Egypt
 - B. He was mighty in the Old Testament Scriptures
 - C. He was an excellent orator
 - D. He believed in the coming Messiah Isaiah 40:3
 - E. He had not been introduced to Jesus

- III. Paul instructed 12 disciples of John the Baptist Acts 19:1-7
 - A. They believed in the coming Messiah
 - B. They had not heard of the Holy Spirit
 - C. They were baptized into Jesus Christ
 - D. They were filled with the Holy Spirit
 - 1. Tongues was a sign for unbelieving Israel
Isaiah 28:11; 1 Corinthians 14:21
 - 2. How can I be filled with the Holy Spirit?
Ephesians 5:18; Luke 11:13
 - a. I must be saved
 - b. I must walk in fellowship
1 John 1:7, 9
 - c. I must yield myself to God
Romans 12:1-2
 - d. I must step out in faith
Galatians 3:3, 5
