Title: Encouraging Others

2 Corinthians 1:3-11

- All God's people need encouragement
 1 Samuel 30:6; Psalm 23:4; 34:4; Job 13:15; Matthew 26:37-38; 39, 42
- God takes us all through the school of <u>adversity</u> Romans 5:3-5; James 1:2-4
- Paul and his team were not exempt from trial
- Adversity causes the <u>fragrance</u> of Christ to flows out from me 2 Corinthians 2:13-14; Song of Solomon 4:12-14, 16
- He is not <u>victorious</u> who never had a trial Romans 8:31, 37; Philippians 4:13; Job 13:15; Mark 14:36
- Paul knew what it meant to be <u>overwhelmed</u> by trials 2 Corinthians 1:8
- God is our source of <u>mercy</u> and <u>comfort</u> 2 Corinthians 1:3
- I must not keep God's comfort to myself 2 Corinthians 1:4
- God's comfort is in proportion to my troubles 2 Corinthians 1:5-8 Philippians 1:6; 1 Corinthians 16:9
- My trials should <u>crowd</u> me to the cross and empty tomb 2 Corinthians 1:9 Romans 6:6-8, 11; Galatians 2:20; Romans 8:36; Matthew 16:24-25
- My Salvation is in three tenses: 2 Corinthians 1:<u>10</u>
 - ✓ Past I was delivered from hell
 - ✓ Present God <u>continues</u> to deliver me from temptation and the power of Satan 1 Peter 5:8
 - ✓ Future God's grace is sufficient to save me for <u>eternity</u> Philippians 1:6; Romans 8:32, 35-38

Five ways that God comforts me

- 1) in giving me salvation
- 2) by giving me the Holy Spirit
- 3) through the Bible
- 4) by delivering and healing me
- 5) through the <u>prayers</u> and encouragement of fellow <u>believers</u> 2 Corinthians 1:11 1 Samuel 12:23
