Walk in His light (5) – (Ephesians 5:8-10 / Psalm 119:105, 130)

Why has God abandoned His people? (6-8) – (Deuteronomy 31:16-18)

They engage in pagan practices (Deuteronomy 12:29-31)

They overflow with riches (Ecclesiastes 5:10-11 / James 1:9-11; 2:5-7; 5:1-6)

They have powerful armies (II Chronicles 26:11-16)

They are full of idols (Psalm 115:2-8)

What will result from these practices? (9-11) – (Leviticus 26:27-35)

Humbled and brought low

Hiding from the dread of God's splendor

Honor will be accorded only to One (He alone is worthy)

When will this occur? (12-21) – (I Peter 4:12-19)

The Day of the Lord – the ultimate fulfillment of His judgment

The arrogance of man is brought low (Job 34:14-15)

The idols will be totally destroyed

The people will flee and attempt to hide (Revelation 6:15-17)

The Lord will shake the earth (Hebrews 12:26-29)

Where will you place your trust? (Proverbs 29:25 / Psalm 27:1-3; 60:11-12)

Isaiah 2:5-22 Stop Trusting in Man

Walk in His light (5) – (Ephesians 5:8-10 / Psalm 119:105, 130)

We are called out of darkness to walk by the light of His word seeking to please Him Why has God abandoned His people? (6-8) – (Deuteronomy 31:16-18)

Because the abandoned Him and His ways (as was foretold)

They engage in pagan practices (Deuteronomy 12:29-31)

Conforming to the culture (Romans 12:2)

They overflow with riches (Ecclesiastes 5:10-11 / James 1:9-11; 2:5-7; 5:1-6)

Focused on the pleasures of this life (Luke 18:19-25 / Matthew 13:22)

They have powerful armies (II Chronicles 26:11-16)

Trusting in themselves and their accomplishments, they become proud They are full of idols (Psalm 115:2-8)

Many things in their lives take priority over God (Exodus 20:1-6)

What will result from these practices? (9-11) – (Leviticus 26:27-35)

God will increase the severity of His judgments until they respond Humbled and brought low

They have nothing left of their own making to trust in or boast about Hiding from the dread of God's splendor

Fearful of what God will do next

Honor will be accorded only to One (He alone is worthy)

He will be exalted (Philippians 2:9-11)

When will this occur? (12-21) – (I Peter 4:12-19)

He judges His own now – mini cleansing before the purge

The Day of the Lord – the ultimate fulfillment of His judgment

Other judgments point to this future event

The arrogance of man is brought low (Job 34:14-15)

Our very breath is in His hands – He does not answer to us (Job 40:1-5)

The idols will be totally destroyed

The people will flee and attempt to hide (Revelation 6:15-17)

The Lord will shake the earth (Hebrews 12:26-29)

We must put our trust in the things that cannot be shaken

Where will you place your trust? (Proverbs 29:25 / Psalm 27:1-3; 60:11-12)

Discussion questions for Isaiah 2:5-22)

What motivates you to walk with God?

Fear of His discipline and/or the results of going my own way (Romans 1:21-32)

Knowing His love and sacrifice for me and the joy of walking in His presence

What can try God's patience to the point of Him pouring out His wrath? (II Chronicles 36:16 / Matthew 23:13-15, 27-28, 33-36)

Consistent rebellion and refusal to trust in Him Leading others astray be false teaching and self righteousness

What is God's purpose in pouring out His judgments? (Ezekiel 20:32-44 / Malachi 3:2-6 / Psalm 76:10)

Disciplining those He loves (Hebrews 12:4-11)
Purging His people to redeem a remnant for Himself
Judging the wicked who harm His people (II Thessalonians 1:4-9)

How can we know when the Day of the Lord is at hand? (Matthew 24:4-12)

By the signs of His coming: the birth-pains; the hearts of men; the deceptions; the return of His people Israel to their land; the geopolitical landscape of the world; technology; etc.

What is the result of putting our trust in:

Man? (Jeremiah 17:5)

At the very least, disappointment At the worst, destruction

Ourselves? (Proverbs 28:26)

Disillusionment – learning the truth of John 15:5

Disappointment – over my failures

Depression – seeing the condition of my heart

The Lord? (Proverbs 3:5-6 / Jeremiah 17:7)

In Him we are kept safe

In Him we are given hope (II Corinthians 4:16-18)

In Him we are led to follow the plan and purpose of our lives
