Isaiah 7:10-25 Getting Our Attention

The Sign (10-17) God gives us signs of what lies ahead to reassure us

Testing God (Deuteronomy 6:16) It is a command to not put God to the test

By foolish actions (Matthew 4:7) An example: name it and claim it

By disobedience (Psalm 95:9-10) including refusing God's help

Two fulfillments near and far (example: Daniel 9:27; 11:

Isaiah's son (Isaiah 8:3-4) virgin = young maiden

promise = deliverance from war

God's son (Matthew 1:20-21) virgin = incarnation (a miracle)

Promise = deliverance from sin

Two dreaded kings the odds are not in your favor

Rezin of Damascus (Aram) and Pekah of Samaria (Ephraim)

As with Gideon (Judges 7:12) or Jehoshaphat (II Chronicles 20:2-3)

Russia and Iran (Ezekiel 38 & 39)

Israel is overrun and then God intervenes

The Shaving (18-25) – being brought to the brink of disaster (II Timothy 4:14-18)

Up to the neck (Isaiah 8:7-8; 37:18-20)

Occupation – the land has been taken over (Exodus 33: 5-6, 15-16)

How do we stand out as a nation – one nation under God or divided by unbelief

Oppression – living under siege (Judges 10:11-16)

God's judgment often includes living under wicked rulers (II Chronicles 12:5)

Our sustenance – God provides for His remnant (Matthew 6:33-34)

Those who seek God first will be cared for

Only thorns and briers – land becoming desolate

Sin of commission (Leviticus 18:28)

When a nation practices perverse immorality (Romans 1:26-28)

Sin of omission (Leviticus 25:2-5 / James 4:17)

When godly practices are continually ignored and neglected

Why should we never compromise or turn from God, even when the circumstances are overwhelmingly against us? (Romans 8:31-34)

The worst men can do is take our lives, not our souls (Luke 12:4-7)

The omnipotent Creator is on our side (Luke 18:24-27)

Compromise leads to doubt, discouragement, and defeat (II Peter 1:9-11)

Why does God allow things to get so bad, that people lose hope? (Revelation 7:9-10)

To bring us to the end of ourselves (Job 40:1-5)

To turn us from trusting in the temporal (II Corinthians 4:16-18)

To draw us to Himself – He is our only hope (II Corinthians 1:8-11)

What can help us regain our hope? (Titus 2:11-14)

Learning to wait upon the LORD (Psalm 27:14 / Isaiah 40:28-31)

Turning away from idols and/or sin (I Thessalonians 1:9-10)
