Anger turned away (1)

I am nothing apart from Him; my heart is wicked apart from Him Offered His comfort (II Corinthians 1:3-4)

He is with us in our suffering and it is always for a purpose

Afraid no more (2)

God is my salvation (Romans 8:30-35)

He has and will deliver me (II Tim. 4:18) He is on my side and will not leave me God is my strength (Psalm 73:26 / Colossians 1:28-29)

And my portion forever (I will look nowhere else) That I may do His work God is my song (Colossians 3:15-16)

I have a reason to sing: His power, His joy, His praise, Hope that is certain

Ascribe to the LORD (3-6)

With JOY – water from the wells of salvation (Revelation 22:17)

I can drink freely (John 4:14; 7:37-38)

With THANKS – calling on His Name and making known what He has done
(Psalm 78:3-8; 145:3-7) *Grateful hearts passing on to the next generation His Greatness that no one can fathom – yet He knows and dwells with me*With PRAISE – exalting His Name (Psalm 138:2)

The Name above all things and above every name (Philippians 2:9-11)

With SONG – His glorious works spread throughout the world (Psalm 7:17)

A glorious way to share His truth and His works

With SHOUTS – for He is great among His people (Psalm 27:6)

We have no reason to cower or to be ashamed (Romans 1:16)

What kind of responses can turn God's anger away? How should we respond when His anger is turned away from us? (Proverbs 3:34 / Psalm 51:17 / I Chronicles 28:9 / Judges 10:15-16) **God** desires repentance (II Peter 3:9), He is looking for broken and contrite hearts that cry out to Him for mercy. He desires those who wholeheartedly seek after Him. When we recognize the grace and mercy that was shown to us on the cross – the great love He has for us – our hearts should overflow with gratitude and praise toward the only One who is worthy.

What truths about God can alleviate our fears? (Deuteronomy 31:6, 8 / Romans 8:38-39)

The LORD is with me – He never leaves me or forsakes me. The Lord is on my side, no one can judge me for He has forgiven me. Nothing can separate me from God's love.

What are some ways we can ascribe to the LORD the glory that is due Him? (Hebrews 13:15 / Luke 11:1-4 / John 4:23-24 / John14:23) When we confess His name – praising Him for anything good in my life – giving Him the glory for all things. When we cry out to Him and prayer, acknowledging our need of Him and exalting His name. When we seek to worship Him in Spirit and in truth, not shying away from His word and surrendering our spirits to Him. When we demonstrate our love for Him by walking in obedience to Him – experiencing His presence in our lives
