Virulent judgment against her enemies (5-8)

Severe – pounded to fine dust Sudden – in an instant (I Thessalonians 5:1-3) Seeing empty visions of hope – then reality hits (I Kings 21:17-19)

Vision is like a sealed scroll (9-12)

Sightless – blinding themselves (I John 2:11 / II Corinthians 4:4) Staggering – but not from beer (Psalm 107:27) Sealed – not wanting to hear (II Timothy 4:3-4)

Vain worship (13-16)

Honor only with lips – hearts are hard (Mark 7:6-8) Higher than man's ways (Isaiah 55:8-9) – following rules taught by men Hiding plans – believing that God does not know?? (Hebrews 4:13) He who made us – blaming the Creator (Job 42:1-6)

Judgment and Revival

Visionary City, Ariel, will fall (1-4) God's people are the 1st to be judged (I Peter 4:17)

Same old cycle of religious practice (Isaiah 1:13) *Ritual w/o relationship* Siege works set up against her (Isaiah 6:11-13) *He judges, but preserves a remnant*

Virulent judgment against her enemies (5-8) It will be worse for God's enemies

Severe – pounded to fine dust *There is no hope w/o turning to God* Sudden – in an instant (I Thessalonians 5:1-3) *Many will be surprised (II Peter 3:3-4)* Seeing empty visions of hope – then reality hits (I Kings 21:17-19) *No hiding from God*

Vision is like a sealed scroll (9-12) Unable to perceive or understand His Word

Sightless – blinding themselves (I John 2:11 / II Corinthians 4:4) *refusing to face reality* Staggering – but not from beer (Psalm 107:27) *At their wits end – how did this happen?* Sealed – not wanting to hear (II Timothy 4:3-4) *pretending it won't happen to them*

Vain worship (13-16) Not from the heart - Not in the Spirit - Not according to truth

Honor only with lips – hearts are hard (Mark 7:6-8) **God hates pretense** Higher than man's ways (Isaiah 55:8-9) – following rules taught by men **who knows best** Hiding plans – believing that God does not know?? (Hebrews 4:13) **He sees all** He who made us – blaming the Creator (Job 42:1-6) **to sin is my nature and my choice**

Victorious revival is coming (17-24) all His promises for Israel and the Church will be fulfilled

Healing of the land (Ezekiel 36:8-12) *restoring that which was judged*Healing of the body (Romans 7:24-25/Philippians 3:21) *made fit for heaven (I Cor 15:50)*Healing of the soul (I Corinthians 13:11; 14:20 / I Peter 1:13 / I Thessalonians 5:23-24) *My thoughts aligned with His – He will keep us until that Day*

Discussion questions for Isaiah 29

When are "good works" a bad thing? What is God truly seeking from us? (Isaiah 64:6 / Romans 3:20; 4:4-5) When are works are and attempt to earn our salvation.
When we believe are works will makes God love us more.
When are works are used to somehow offset our sinful behavior.
God wants our hearts – He wants us to put our complete trust in Him – He wants us to grow in our relationship with Him (II Peter 1:5-8)

Why is it extremely dangerous to ignore God and persecute His people? (Genesis 12:3 / Zechariah 2:8 / II Thessalonians 1:6-9 / Psalm 73:16-20 / Mark 8:38) God watches over His people and His children. Continuing to ignore Him leads to a hard heart – which may never respond (II Thess. 2:10-12) Curses and punishment await those who persecute His people. Their eternal destiny is a high cost to pay for temporary pleasure.

What can cause a person to become blinded to the truth? What opens a person's eyes to the truth? (I Corinthians 1:20-25; 2:13-16/ 3:18-20 / Psalm 19:1-4 / Romans 1:18-20 / John 12:47-50) *Becoming wise in your own eyes – somehow imagining that you know better than God. Ignoring the evidence of our Creator as seen and understood by His creation. Ignoring His Word – and the Spirit's call on our lives* Only when we open our hearts to believe and receive His love and His Spirt, will we be able to know and understand truth.

What is vain worship? (John 4:24) Anything not done in Spirit and in truth Following rules and rituals given by men rather than letting His Word and His Spirit lead us Being caught up in emotional response not centered on His truth

What is vain planning? (James 4:13-17 / Luke 7:30 / Ephesians 2:10) Making my plans without seeking His will. Ignoring – because of my plans – that opportunities God places in my path Missing God's purpose for my life because of my pride and my refusal to repent of my sin

What is vain complaining? (Philippians 2:14; 4:6-8 / James 1:2-4) Blaming God for the troubles I bring upon myself Not trusting God to use the troubles He allows in my life Is essence – ALL COMPLAINING – which demonstrates a lack of gratitude toward God
