State your case before God (1-4)

He will silence you (Proverbs 30:5-6)

He has called for your judgment (Revelation 20:12)

He (the first and the last – Revelation 1:8, 17; 21:6) will carry His purpose to completion

Spur one another on (5-7)

Trembling before God – those who will not turn

Trying to encourage others in their hopeless state (I Samuel 28:21-25)

Trusting empty notions (Isaiah 55:2)

Strength is found only in God (8-20)

Chosen by Him (8-9) (Ephesians 1:4)

Courage from Him ((10-14) – even though we are worms

Conquerors in Him (15-16) (Romans 8:37)

Consider His promises (17-20) (II Corinthians 1:20)

Seeing the future (21-29)

Proclaim what the future holds (21-22) – only God has that power

Proving themselves worthless (23-24) (Psalm 115:8)

Prophesying about the future (25-26) – verification needed (Deuteronomy 18:21-22)

Providing true counsel (27-29) – He is the only reliable source (Proverbs 3:5-6; 16:1,9)
