Carrying a bow – no mention of arrows

Crown given to him

Conqueror – he is bent on conquest

The red horse (3-4)

Peace is taken from the earth (Isaiah 48:22 / Luke 19:42 / II Thessalonians 2:6-7)

Power to make men slay each other (Galatians 5:15)

Powerful weapon – given a large sword

The black horse (5-6) (Amos 8:11-14)

Expensive rations – a days wages for one person's food

Essentials protected (oil for cooking & wine for purifying)

The pale horse (7-8) (Hebrews 9:27)

Death and Hades prevailing

Destroying one-fourth of the world's population (Ezekiel 14:12-23/II Corinthians 5:21)
